HOW IT WORKS:

- 1** Throughout March 2025, Baltimore-area children in fifth grade and younger may visit any Enoch Pratt Free Library location and show their library card to receive a Read to Reef bookmark, while supplies last.



- 2** Check out the list of the National Aquarium's favorite aquatic- and conservation-themed books, or ask your librarian for suggestions. Borrow, then read or listen to someone read any five of these books and record them on your Read to Reef bookmark.



- 3** When your reading is complete, head over to aqua.org/read-tickets to reserve up to four admission tickets to the National Aquarium. Read to Reef families may reserve their visit through June 15, 2025.



Each participating child must have a valid library card; child must be present with parent, grandparent or legal guardian to sign up for a Pratt library card or First Card. Visit prattlibrary.org for details.

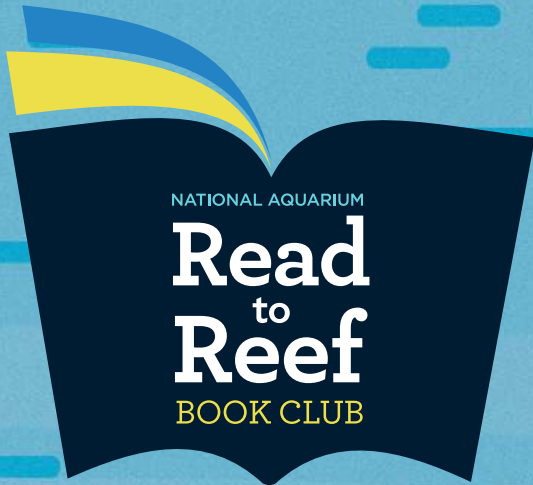
